

WHAT TO BRING

We are not providing lunch as part of the trip, so please have lunch ahead of time or bring it along.

You will need a tent, sleeping bags, warm clothing for the night, flashlight with good batteries (the cubs will want to keep them on all night), water bottle, rain poncho, (lets hope we don't need them) sturdy shoes and a change of clothing. Optional but nice to have are an air mattress and I highly recommend folding chairs for sitting around the campfire.

We will be running in the fields and in the woods so sneakers or hiking boots will work fine. No sandals. This goes for siblings too. They will be allowed to participate with the scouts if they are prepared.

NOTE THAT IF YOU DON'T HAVE YOUR OWN TENT, PLEASE DON'T FEEL AS THOUGH YOU CAN'T GO OR NEED TO BUY A TENT. THE PACK HAS SEVERAL EXTRA TENTS THAT ARE AVAILABLE ON A FIRST COME/FIRST SERVED BASIS! YOU MUST, HOWEVER, CALL ME AHEAD OF TIME TO CHECK AVAILABILITY AND TO ARRANGE TO PICK IT UP.

IF YOU CAN'T MAKE IT UNTIL LATER IN THE DAY (SOCCER GAMES, ETC.) COME THEN! EVEN IF YOU MISS SOME ACTIVITES YOU'LL STILL ENJOY DINNER, GAMES, THE CAMPFIRE AND WHATEVER ELSE WE HAVE GOING ON. LIKewise, IF CANNOT SPEND THE NIGHT COME FOR THE DAY AND LEAVE WHEN YOU HAVE TO

We will provide an afternoon snack, supper Saturday night with campfire treats and breakfast Sunday morning, but feel free to bring snacks. **Please do not bring food into your tents** however because there are plenty of critters that would like a free meal (and you won't want to spend the night with them).

RULES

Camping is for cubs and their parents, siblings or guardian. Sleeping is by family only with parent/guardian in the tent. Scouts who are siblings require only one parent/guardian in a tent. Unrelated people/scouts may not be in a tent together.

Please do not bring electronic games (if you need them for the ride lock them in the car)- we have plenty of games and activities for the cubs and we want them to experience the special activities of camping and cub camaraderie.

DO NOT BRING ALCOHOL. It is against state law to have alcohol in a state park and it is against BSA rules to have alcohol at a campout. If you have alcohol you will be asked to leave the camp out and cub scouting.
